



**Cost of Attendance
 Academic Year 2009-2010**

Kapi`olani Community College utilizes standard budgets which are updated annually by the University of Hawai`i Office of the Vice President of Student Affairs. The budgets are a reflection of the changes in national cost of living figures and local community costs. The cost of attendance includes more than the items the student pays to the institution.

HOW YOUR NEED IS DETERMINED

$$\begin{aligned} & \text{Cost of Attendance (COA)} \\ & - \text{Expected Family Contribution (EFC)} \\ & = \text{Demonstrated Financial Need} \end{aligned}$$

By law, federal aid recipients cannot receive more than their Cost of Attendance. The Expected Family Contribution is based on the income and asset information you provided on your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

 Non-resident tuition cost is \$6,528 per year (\$3,264 per semester) full-time/12 credits or \$272 per credit
